With a single application, students enrolled or who are seeking to enroll at the Northwest School of Wooden Boatbuilding can apply for multiple participating scholarships. Scholarship funds are eligible for degree and diploma programs only.

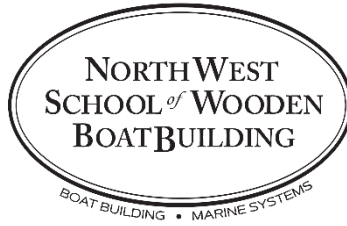
Eligibility Criteria:

Eligibility criteria for ALL participating scholarships:

- Individuals must be an enrolled student OR must have submitted an application and are in the process of becoming an enrolled student. Those individuals who are not yet enrolled students must complete the Admissions Process which includes submitting an application and supporting transcripts/documents, paying associated fees, screening and approval by the Admissions Committee, and signing an enrollment agreement by Monday, September 1, 2022. - Scholarships are needs based and applicants must have completed a FAFSA application to determine if they qualify for a scholarship.
- Applicants must complete a scholarship application, including answering three essay questions.
- Priority will be given to needs-based applicants who plan to enter the maritime trades upon graduation.

Award Details:

- Scholarship award(s) will be applied to a student's account as a tuition reduction. Amounts are not paid directly to a student.
- Award amounts: see scholarship matrix
- Scholarships will be awarded in August and will be applied quarterly, beginning the Fall Quarter.
- Students must be in good academic standing and attendance standing when the quarterly scholarship payment is made. Students on probation for any reason will forfeit any unpaid scholarships amounts.
- The school reserves the right to reduce the award should a student's total gift aid exceed the cost of tuition and tools for the program.

- All applications received by the deadline will be presented to the Scholarship Committee for consideration and, depending on the scholarship, may also be submitted to the funding organization for final decision.
