The Northwest School of Wooden Boatbuilding is a recognized vocational institution of Washington State and is accredited through the ACCSC, a nationally recognized accrediting agency. A typical day starts with 1-2 hours of lecture, then the rest of the day is spent doing hands-on work in the boat shops, using use a wide array of both hand-tools and power tools, including table saws, band saws, planers and jointers. As described in the school Catalogue, students must be able to handle the rigorous physical requirements of the School's boat shop activities.

- Be on your feet for extended periods of time. Students are in the boat shops from 10 am to 5 pm daily, with one hour off for lunch and two 15-minute breaks. That means about 6 hours a day on your feet.
- Have the flexibility to climb, crawl on the floor, and work in tight spaces.
- Work at varied heights, sometimes on scaffolding.
- Lift items as heavy as 50 lbs. multiple times throughout the day.
- Work with your arms raised above your head.
- Be able to work near noise and dust.
- Be able to operate machinery & equipment.
