I grew up fixing things, working with my hands through long days on the farm. After graduating I started to realize how interesting boats were. They are incredibly complicated, 3 dimensional, and afford an artistic, creative outlet for my architectural skills. I can look at a boat from the outside and understand all the pieces that connect on the inside, i.e., how it's put together. I came to Port Townsend to attend the Wooden Boat Festival and never left. I first landed a job on the schooner Adventuress and then enrolled in the NW School of Wooden Boat Building. I started working as a shipwright in our PT Boat Haven right away and have been here ever since. My shipwright skills have been enlarged and enhanced by the knowledge gleaned from the incredible craftspeople I work with every day here in The Port of Port Townsend. I met my wife, Kirsten here.
